AMENDMENT TO BURNET COUNTY ORDER TO STAY IN PLACE AND STAY SAFE TO CORRECT A CLERICAL ERROR

On March 25, 2020, Burnet County Judge declared a <u>STAY IN PLACE AND STAY SAFE</u> Order to become effective at 11:59 p.m. on March 25, 2019. Said Order is modified as follows:

SECTION 6. All public and private gatherings of more than ten people occurring outsidea residence are prohibited, except for the limited purposes as expressly defined in <u>Section 10</u>. Nothing in this <u>Stay in Place and Stay Safe</u> prohibits the gathering of members of the same Residence at their place of Residence.

AS AUTHORIZED BY SECTION 418.173 OF THE TEXAS GOVERNMENT CODE AND AS ADOPTED IN BURNET COUNTY'S EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT PLAN, A FAILURE TO COMPLY WITH THE BURNET COUNTY EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT PLAN OR WITH ANY RULE, ORDER OR ORDINANCE ADOPTED UNDER SAID PLAN, INCLUDING, BUT NOT LIMITED TO THIS <u>STAY IN PLACE AND STAY SAFE</u>, SHALL BE A CRIMINAL OFFENSE PUNISHABLE BY A FINE THAT DOES NOT EXCEED \$1,000.00 OR CONFINEMENT IN JAIL FOR A TERM NOT TO EXCEED 180 DAYS. THE BURNET COUNTY SHERIFF'S OFFICE, BURNET COUNTY CONSTABLES, AND OTHER LICENSED PEACE OFFICERS ARE HEREBY AUTHORIZED TO ENFORCE THIS ORDER AND ORDERS REFERENCED HEREIN.

This Amendment to the <u>Stay in Place and Stay Safe</u> is adopted on this the 25 th <u>day of March</u>, 2020 to be effective as of the date and time set out herein.
