



Purpose

Burnet County and the Texas Department of Transportation (TxDOT) are partnering to reconstruct Wirtz Dam Road (County Road 426). Currently, Wirtz Dam Road is an undivided two-lane roadway which extends from RM 1431 to the Colorado River and from the Colorado River to RM 2147. Growth in Central Texas has led to increased traffic and reduced mobility on major corridors, including US 281. The goal of the project is to improve regional connectivity, mobility, and safety by reconstructing Wirtz Dam Road and building a new crossing over the Colorado River.

Overview

Limits: From RM 1431 to RM 2147

Location: Burnet County, Texas

Length: 3.68 miles

Estimated Cost: \$35 million

The project proposes to:

- Reconstruct Wirtz Dam Road to be a two-lane, undivided roadway with paved shoulders.
- Build a new bridge over Lake Marble Falls.
- Add left-turn and right-turn lanes and add deceleration and acceleration lanes at multiple locations.

Construction is anticipated to begin June 2025.
